Knowing Your Seed Germination

In a little under a month, the 2020 crop will be going into the ground. You want to use the best seed you can. Have you checked yours?

Harvest conditions last fall were poor to say the least. The seed testing labs are reporting that many samples being submitted are showing very poor germination - in some cases 80 per cent or lower. And with poor germination often comes seed borne disease.

Unknowingly using poor seed can lead to thin stands, increased tillering and uneven maturity, not to mention possible lower yield.

If you seed test, you will know what you've got. You can adjust your seeding rate if the germination is reduced. Seed treatment will control seed borne disease. Or you can find alternative seed.

We encourage everyone to check your seed for germination and vigor and if possible, disease. If it isn't up to standard, give us a call. We handle a wide variety of bulk seed.

Can you afford to seed only a partial crop? Only a rich man can afford to use poor seed.

Protect the Seed

Seed treatments for cereals have been common place for many growers for well over a decade, but how many growers know what they actually do in regards to protection of their seed? Starting your crop off healthy and strong is one of the key components to growing a bumper crop. Seed treatments like Vibrance Quattro, Raxil Pro, or Insure FX protect your seed from a variety of diseases such as root rot, seedling blight, seed rot, smut and bunt. You may think, "I've had my seed tested and it came back with a high germination and relatively disease-free, so I don't need to treat my seed." This is not true. There are many diseases that live in the soil and on crop residues that can affect your seed. Environmental conditions that slow the germination and growth of the seedling gives soil borne diseases more time to infect the seed.
